New Business in Town

In the early 1900's a candy factory was located on 7th Street. The company was so successful that in 1902 they



built a machine shop for their delivery trucks on the corner of Pine and Hall in Allentown, behind the factory. The upper floor was used by the factory as a packaging area. The small warehouse had been used as a storage facility for many years and was recently purchased by Kenny

and Shelby Ek. This enterprising couple resides on Turner Street and have played an integral part in the transformation of Old Allentown. Their home was one of the featured houses in last year's House Tour and they are now working to refurbish this charming landmark warehouse.

Upgrading and renovation of the warehouse is well under way. Kenny states that he loves the simplicity of the solid



brick building as well as appreciating the fact that it is located off of the heavier traveled streets in town. Involvement in the neighborhood is a primary goal of this couple. *KeneK Photography* will open the studio by this Fall. A specialized photography business that caters to art clients, it is

a digital refuge for artists to have their work photographically documented. Kenny also provides business cards, postcards, prints and giclee prints. He has been in business for 15 years and is delighted that his vision of a larger professional space is materializing.

Shelby owns and operates her own business, Salvage and Art, with a showroom at the Weil Antique Center in



Allentown. Kenny re-purposes found items by transforming them into furniture, which Shelby then sells. Some of the pieces will be worked on in the warehouse studio before being transported to Weil. Eclectic housewares and wall art are also available. It is well worth the time to

seek out these one of a kind items.

The restoration of this historical warehouse is another important step in Old Allentown's revitalization. After the business opens take time to walk by and note the transformation of this historic building.

YARD WASTE RECYCLING

CURBSIDE: Yard waste is collected once a week on your recycling night. For 2015 it will begin Sunday, April 5 and end the week of Thanksgiving (Sunday, November 22-Friday, November 27).

GRASS, YARD WASTE, BRANCHES, TRIMMINGS, ETC. Place in a can separate from your trash. Yellow stickers are available at the Bureau of Recycling and Solid Waste to identify your yard waste can.

★ Please DO NOT USE paper lawn bags anymore.
Use containers with yard waste stickers as pictured below for grass and other yard waste.

FALL LEAVES Place in containers for regular collection through the week of Thanksgiving. Please check the City's website www.allentownpa.gov for the fall leaf collection program information or call the Streets Department at 610-437-7638.

CHRISTMAS TREES and other yard waste are collected the second and fourth full weeks in January on your recycling night. Remove plastic bags, stands and all decorations.

Faith Church Volunteer Clean Up Day

On Sunday, April 26th 1100 volunteers from Faith Church came into Allentown to perform a variety of tasks. They gave

up their Sunday worship to volunteer in the City. In groups from 10 to 100 they helped clean 12 schools and 14 parks and cemeteries throughout town.



The Union and West End Cemetery had

50 church volunteers as well as additional district volunteers.



They cleaned and spread mulch in the rose garden, around young trees in the cemetery (approx. 30), in the Grand Army of the Republic Memorial and 10^{th} street from Chew to the gate. Volunteers also picked up trash

and leaves (67 bags) as they raked the perimeter of the cemetery and planted over 90 new ground cover plants (Goldenwort) on 10th street starting at North street. **A HUGE** thank you goes out to these much appreciated volunteers and to the Parks Department and the Bureau of Recycling who provided the mulch and tools to complete these projects.
